What is Supporting People?



Supporting People funds services to help prevent people in Gwent from losing their homes and to help people in Gwent live independently



Supporting People pays for housing related support services and it is paid to the organisation that give you support



Housing related support includes:

Help to contact other people like, housing, social services, health, doctors and the job centre

Help to make sure your home is safe and secure

Help with paperwork and budgeting

Working Together

Welsh Government has made some new laws:



The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015

The Housing (Wales) Act 2014

The Social Services & Well-being (Wales) Act 2014

The Violence against Women, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (Wales) Act 2015



These laws say that services such as housing, social services, health, probation and the police must work together with the people who receive services to make sure that services are developed that people need



In 2012 a committee was formed called the Gwent Regional Collaborative Committee (RCC) – they are responsible for making sure that housing related support projects are delivering the right results for people using them in Gwent

Services



There are 83 support providers across Gwent who receive £20,629,231 of Supporting People money. They are working hard to make Gwent a better place to live



Support will help you to find a home

Support can help you to live in a home that is safe and warm

Support can help you learn the skills you need to live on your own or look after your home



If you have been in trouble with the police, support can help you stay out of trouble

If you use drugs or alcohol, support can help you to live independently and stop using drugs or drinking

Challenges



There are lots more people that need to receive support



It is harder for people to find the housing that they need

With the benefit changes, people are finding it harder to manage their money



There are not enough support services available to help all the people that need support

Services need to work better together



Money is not always spent in the best way

We are not getting any more money to pay for the services that are needed

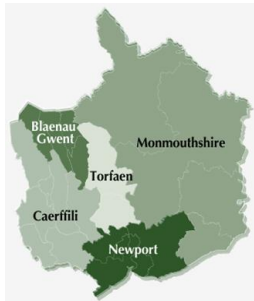

- Services for people with Learning Disabilities



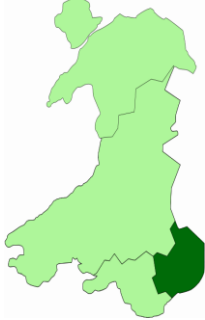
We developed an on line library to make it easier for people to find our documents
